Message from the Head

As we draw close to the end of the year, we can't help but stop and look back. What a year it has been. I hope that it is never to be repeated in the life time of all our children. But it is important that we remember and celebrate the positives that there have been in amongst the hardships. There are things, however large or small, that we have all done that we never otherwise would have done. And we have all learnt, the children most especially, to show resilience and find strategies to manage change. This will serve them well as they move onwards through their lives.

But as I look across the school now, both children and staff, I have never seen such exhaustion at this time of year before. I am sure it is the same for you all at home as well. The toll of the burden that we are all carrying is very apparent. The glimmer of the time we are allowed to share with a few others over Christmas is just about keeping everyone going and their spirits up. It is the importance of this for everyone this year which is at the heart of the Acorn Education Trust's decision to close schools a day early next week. It is about doing everything we can to ensure that everyone can relax and enjoy this precious time.

I appreciate that the early closure maybe causing disruption for you at home. But by working together we can help ensure the best of holidays and celebrations for us all.

Please remember to wear school uniform and just replace the school jumper with a Christmas one. 
