# Message from the Deputy and Head

We hope you had a lovely break over half term, and managed to enjoy some quality time together with your family, so you are arriving at the start of what is always a very busy and fun term, refreshed and relaxed!

Next Thursday Keevil will be undergoing its annual Quality Assurance visit by Acorn. This is when the other Executive Headteachers as well as the CEO, Sara Edwards, come in to look at lessons, children's work, talk to pupils and staff and get a snapshot of how well the school is doing. It is more developmental than an OFSTED inspection as it looks at those areas of the school life that could be improved and examines how that could be done. The feedback will be used to inform our Development Plans for next year and will also be discussed by the Academy Council. We will make sure you are aware of the outcomes too.

Our Diocesan Advisor has recommended that we share with you the theme we are addressing through our whole School Collective Worship each term, so you can explore and develop this with your children at home if you so wish. This term's theme is 'Truthfulness', a value which we are sure we can all agree as being very important. Through a series of Worships this half term, we will be exploring with the children Biblical teachings around Truthfulness and how children can apply these lessons in their own lives.

During the TD Day on Monday all of the staff spent time thinking about how we manage behaviour within the school. This is an area that we are proud of, and quite rightly want to maintain the high standard we have achieved. On the reverse of this sheet, you will find the plan that we created, which does not represent a particular change to how we currently manage behaviour but will ensure consistency across the school. However more importantly, it highlights behaviours that we want to develop and reward in our children as being beneficial to their learning. This will be shared with all children over the coming week.

We finally have some good news to pass on. Miss Stather found out just before half term that she has been chosen to be the teacher who will set up and run 'Link 2', the new specialist unit that Acorn is establishing for children who are finding it hard to learn in a mainstream school setting. We are very pleased that she has such a great opportunity to move on to, and that she will be staying in the Acorn family. A very big well done from us all!
