Message from the Head

Happy New Year! I hope that you and your families had a wonderful break over Christmas.

Term always starts apace. At this time of year particularly, as the Spring Term is one of the key learning times in the school year. Teachers are very focused on what individual children need to achieve in their personal learning journey. And as a school we are prioritising those areas that our recently published data showed to be in need of improvement: writing and maths. We were already aware of this, and had implemented new curriculums in these subjects in September. But we continue to keep our focus on adapting and improving these through time spent in TD Days and Staff Meetings. We trialed using some different tests from Y2 upwards in December, as part of an initiative coming out of Acorn, and were very pleased with how the children performed across the school. This indicates that our changes are leading to the improvements we are aiming for. The tests did however, show that spelling is another area of concern across the school. So we are starting to look at how we can facilitate better outcomes in this area as well.

Our theme in Worship this term is Courage. So far we have been thinking about the importance of stepping outside our comfort zone, and how this is particularly key for learning. Also we have considered how the right thing to do is often not the easy thing to do. This is an incredibly important, and hard, lesson for children to learn, and is a fundamental part of our school ethos of always treating others as we would like to be treated. So we will be re-visiting this message across the term.

Privilege Time

In an effort to encourage the best learning behaviours in Summer and Autumn Classes, Golden Time on Friday afternoons is being replaced with Privilege Time. Children have to earn the right to take part in this by showing the expected attitude in lesson time across the week and earning points. Children who do not earn enough points will spend the time finishing off their work instead. We feel that this is a way to reward those children who always do and try their best, and sometimes do not achieve enough recognition for this.
