YEAR 1

EYFS/KS1

Singing Together

- Children will sing well known nursery rhymes to build confidence singing together
- These will include action songs and games and will follow a different theme each week.
- KS1 will develop singing skills through a variety of age appropriate songs.
- They will begin learning songs for the Nativity as well as songs that relate to their class topics.

Pulse and Rhythm

Loud and Quiet (Dynamics)

- Children will learn to recognise and describe loud and quiet sounds
- Learn to control the volume of their singing/speaking voices
- Move their bodies appropriately according to the sounds they hear
- Learn how to play percussion instruments with control, loudly and quietly

KS1 – Pulse and Rhythm (p&r)

- This unit develops children's ability to recognise the difference between pulse and rhythm and to perform with a sense of pulse.
- Pupils will have an opportunity to use Chrome Music Lab to create their own rhythms on a laptop

Y2/Y3 - Pulse and Rhythm

- This unit develops children's ability to create simple rhythmic patterns and perform them rhythmically using notation as a support.
- Pupils will have an opportunity to use Chrome Music Lab to create their own rhythms on a laptop.

Exploring Sounds

High and Low (Pitch)

- In this unit children will learn to recognise and describe high and low music/sounds.
- They will learn to control the pitch of their singing/speaking voices and move their bodies appropriately according to the sounds they hear.
- Pupils will learn about pitched instruments.

KS1 – Exploring Sounds

This unit develops children's ability to identify different sounds and to change and use sounds expressively in response to a stimulus.

Y2/Y3 – Exploring Sounds

 This unit develops children's ability to create, perform and analyse expressive compositions ad extend their sound vocabulary.
